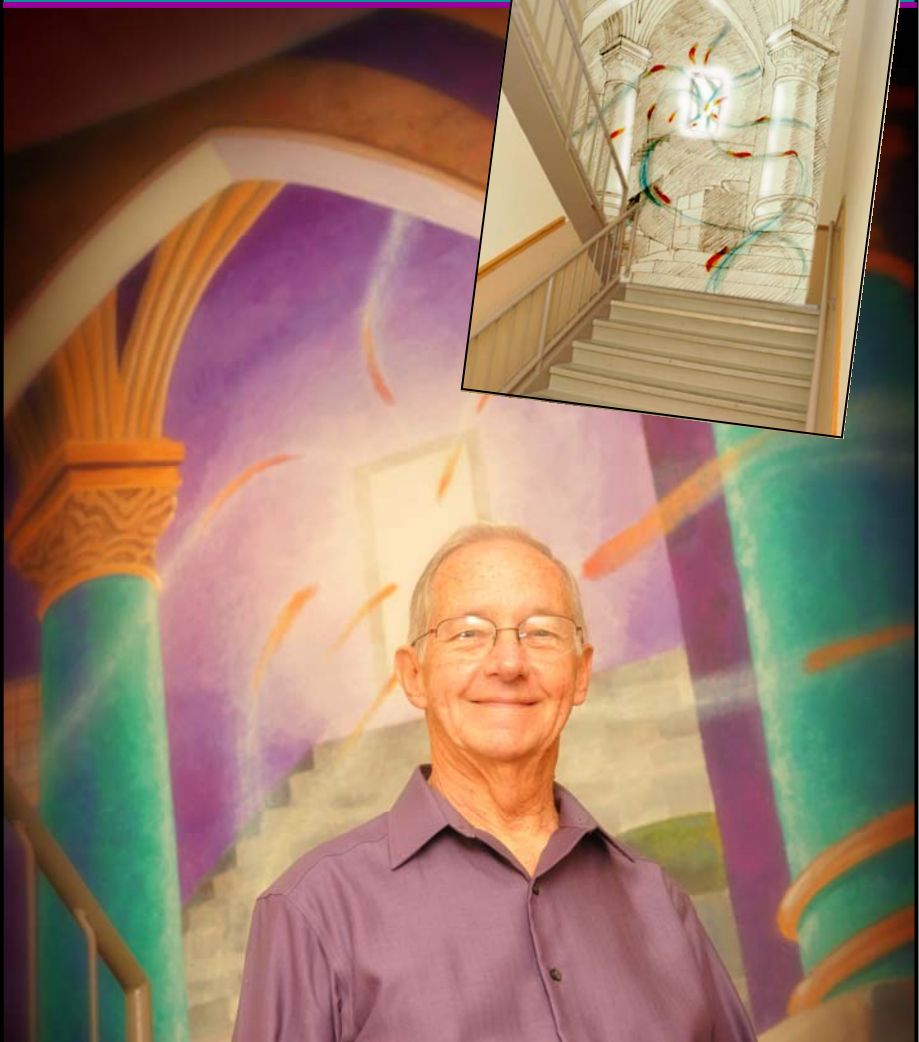


Mt. Auburn United Methodist Church—5/29/2013

My Dear Friends,

Pentecost Sunday 2013 was an unforgettable day for those who experienced it here at Mt. Auburn. Sadly, Pentecost sometimes gets forgotten or ignored in today's world. But, that was not the case here. It was the occasion for unveiling the mural painted by Richard Davis depicting the Holy Spirit coming in power on that historic day. It is on the wall in the stairwell that leads up to the *Upper Rooms* on the second story. How fitting is that?

I'm sure that I don't have to tell you that I love it. It gives me chills and a warm feeling all at the same time. I can't thank Richard enough for his willingness to use his God-given talent to inspire us and lift us to new heights. What a blessing!

And, I'm sure God is pleased because it is honoring to His Holy Spirit. Many folk today are oblivious about the Spirit or refer to Him as an "it." Thank God for the Holy Spirit that has been given to the Church. He is the presence of God in our midst to empower and guide. Where the Holy Spirit is filling the Church, and building us up in love – you really have a Church. Without the Spirit, you only have a gathering of people who are powerless in the face of the spiritual battles in which we are engaged against sin and evil.

I am more than grateful to be a part of a congregation that knows the Holy Spirit, honors Him, and recognizes the need of Him in all that we do. Without the Holy Spirit, we can only accomplish what we can do with our own power and abilities. But, with the Holy Spirit there is no limit, because we are connected to the greatest power source in the universe!

In the Old Testament, we are introduced to man by the name of Zerubbabel. He was the prime builder of the second Temple – the first having been destroyed when Jerusalem fell to the Babylonians. After being in exile about 50 years, he led a group of captives back to Jerusalem to begin rebuilding the Temple. At first the work went well, then came the opposition and work stopped for 17 years. When it looked like the job would never be completed, the Lord sent the prophet Zechariah to Zerubbabel with these words of encouragement:

"This is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel: Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord Almighty." (Zechariah 4:6)

And, Zerubbabel finished the Temple despite the opposition He faced.

I wish that we could really comprehend that and trust what it means for us today. So often, we place limits on what God can do because we think it is going to be done by our power and strength. Our power is barely a candle to the mega-wattage available to us from heaven! Remember that!

On May 20, a massive tornado touched down in Moore, Oklahoma and ripped a 17 mile-long corridor of destruction through this suburb of Oklahoma City flattening entire blocks of homes, two schools and a hospital. 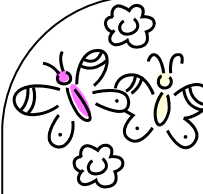
