My Dear Friends,

It's been a difficult and irregular beginning to 2014. Most Sundays the weather has been atrocious making it difficult for some to make it to church. Often the month of January will see an up tick in attendance as several folk make a decision to do better in the New Year. We did not see that this year. Since our offerings usually follow attendance patterns, they, too, have been irregular.

But, it's not the best way to live our lives. God has only given us the moment we have now. We have no assurance about tomorrow. 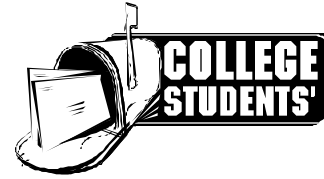

# RECYCLE, RECYCLE, RECYCLE

Mt. Auburn has "officially" recycled all types of materials for two years. In those two years, we've:

- Collected **32.367 TONS** of plastic, cardboard, aluminum, and steel.
- Kept over 70 cubic yards of paper out of the landfills.
- Had faithful volunteers emptying the indoor recycling containers, replacing the bags, and taking full bags to the outdoor recycling bins.

## What can you do?

**1)** Continue to recycle your items from home by bringing them to the church and place them in the two marked bins in the church's northwest parking lot.

### Place the following items in the Comingled Blue and Green Bin:

- All plastic items #1-7 (cups, plastic ware, plates, bottles, communion cups, plastic packaging materials, etc.)
- All cardboard – please FLATTEN all boxes before putting into outside container
- All aluminum and steel products (cans, foil pans or Al foil pieces)
- Phone books, catalogs, other books (remove hardback covers)
- Put items into outside bin loose or in bags (See through bags are best. Avoid black bags if possible or if used, empty contents into container rather than having bag closed.)
- Our provider has asked that GLASS and SYTROFOAM not be placed in the outside bin if at all possible.

### Place the following paper items in the Green and Yellow Paper Bin:

- newspapers, wrapping paper, envelopes, construction paper, writing or printed papers, etc.

**2)** The Recycle Team is also looking for others to help with our effort to empty the inside containers into the outside bins, Anyone can do this job--Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, families, life groups, youth groups, individuals, etc. This is a great in-church service project! A schedule for the year will be created in March. Contact Marge Patton ASAP if you are interested in helping. Training provided.
