

### Christ Youth Bible Club




The Christ Youth Bible Club engages local elementary schools with the Gospel and Bible stories. In Center Grove, Bible clubs meet weekly before or after school.

### Family Ministry and Missions

Persons of all ages at Mt. Auburn, including young people in our Children's and Student Ministries, enjoy supporting missions. For example, children in our 2019 Vacation Bible School raised money for clean drinking water through World Vision. Children also helped out with organizing food-drive and hats and gloves donations, as well as Angel Tree Christmas giving. Older students raised money to combat hunger (also through World Vision) in our 2019 30-Hour Famine event; they also participated in local work projects at Resources of Hope (foster care support) and at Haven's Hope Ranch and Stables. Mt. Auburn high schoolers also helped to meet needs in New Orleans, Louisiana, in 2019 on their annual mission trip. In 2020 they will serve persons in Columbus, Ohio, in partnership with Agora Christian Fellowship. Our high school girls' life group also regularly serves our community; for example, in November 2019 and February 2020, they helped prepare behind-the-scenes items for two Mt. Auburn winter family outreach events. These girls also made cards for Mt. Auburn's Keep-In-Touch ministry and for church members who are not able to get out and about, and they made pet treats to donate to a local animal shelter.

## Interchurch Food Pantry

The Interchurch Food Pantry, located in Franklin, provides people with food at no cost to them, serving Johnson County residents who meet income guidelines of 185 percent of the poverty level or below. Clients may visit the pantry twice per month, and each family member receives food for approximately four days. Other resources and referrals are provided to clients when possible. The pantry exists through the support of more than 45 churches and church affiliates. Mt. # International Missions: The Ends of the Earth



## Kuandaa International

Through Kuandaa International, Mt. Auburn helps to support the mission work of Dr. Jim Hertel. Dr. Hertel served as Mt. Auburn's senior pastor for 25 years, retiring in 2014. After retiring, Dr. Hertel continued the mission work he began in Africa while serving as Mt. Auburn's pastor. Mt. Auburn supports Dr. Hertel's vision for Village Church Planting throughout Uganda. Through Dr. Hertel's leadership, and his partnership with Ugandan pastors, thousands have come to know Christ as Savior, as churches have been planted throughout Uganda.

Dr. Hertel has broadened his focus on village church planting to include having wells dug at the sites of the church plants. This strategy provides an opportunity for people to hear of the living water offered through Jesus Christ as they pump clean water. Children's activity books that teach children how to pray are also distributed. This ministry was initiated and developed by Dale Bronson and Gene Bertolet. At least 30,000 books have been distributed. Mt. Auburn supports Dr. Hertel's ministry efforts, both through financial support and mission teams.

In January 2020, Paul Sanders teamed up with Foundations of Hope in Carmel to install four solar-powered water purifier systems at a school, orphanage, and two churches. Three new water wells were also being dug and were dedicated in February when Dr. Hertel returned to Uganda. Ten thousand more children activity books have been printed and will be distributed by a team including Dr. Hertel, Noah Nsubuga, and John Kiviiri.
